### **Elementary News**

The year is off and rolling, and what a first quarter it has been! Here at Alburnett, we frequently refer to "all means all." We want to ensure we are meeting the needs of every learner however that may look. Each fall, we have reading and math screeners from the state that help us to determine which students are on track and which students need extra support to meet their grade level standards.

The Math Counts Act is a new law put in place for this school year, and it fortunately encompasses things we have already been doing. If a child scores below benchmark, we do additional testing to learn what the child knows and does not yet know. Then, we meet as a grade level team to determine how we can build in those missing skills through an intervention.

This may be the teacher working with the child extra during work time, giving the child different practice problems to start the day, the student being re-taught content after the lesson is over, or any other number of options. The intervention is documented, shared with the family, and progress is monitored regularly. Every 4-6 weeks, the team reconvenes to see if the plan is working and make adjustments as needed.

With the law, there will now be a parent portal for families to follow along with the progress as they wish through the state website, Panorama. We are excited to have this additional layer to partner with families to help every student succeed!

Respect goes a long way in creating a positive school community. Students show respect by listening carefully, using kind words, and being open to different ideas and perspectives. We also emphasize taking care of our spaces and materials—showing pride in our school environment.

#### Responsible

Responsibility is about being prepared, on time, and ready to learn. Our students are encouraged to manage their time wisely, complete their work, and take ownership of their actions. When students take responsibility for their learning, they gain confidence and independence.

#### **Trustworthy**

Trustworthiness means being honest, reliable, and doing what's right—even when no one is watching. We encourage students to communicate openly, follow through on commitments, and act with integrity in all situations.

By focusing on these four attributes, we're helping students develop the character and skills they'll need not just for middle school, but for life.
